To conserve natural resources on all lands in Washington State, through voluntary and incentive-based programs, in collaboration with conservation districts and other partners.

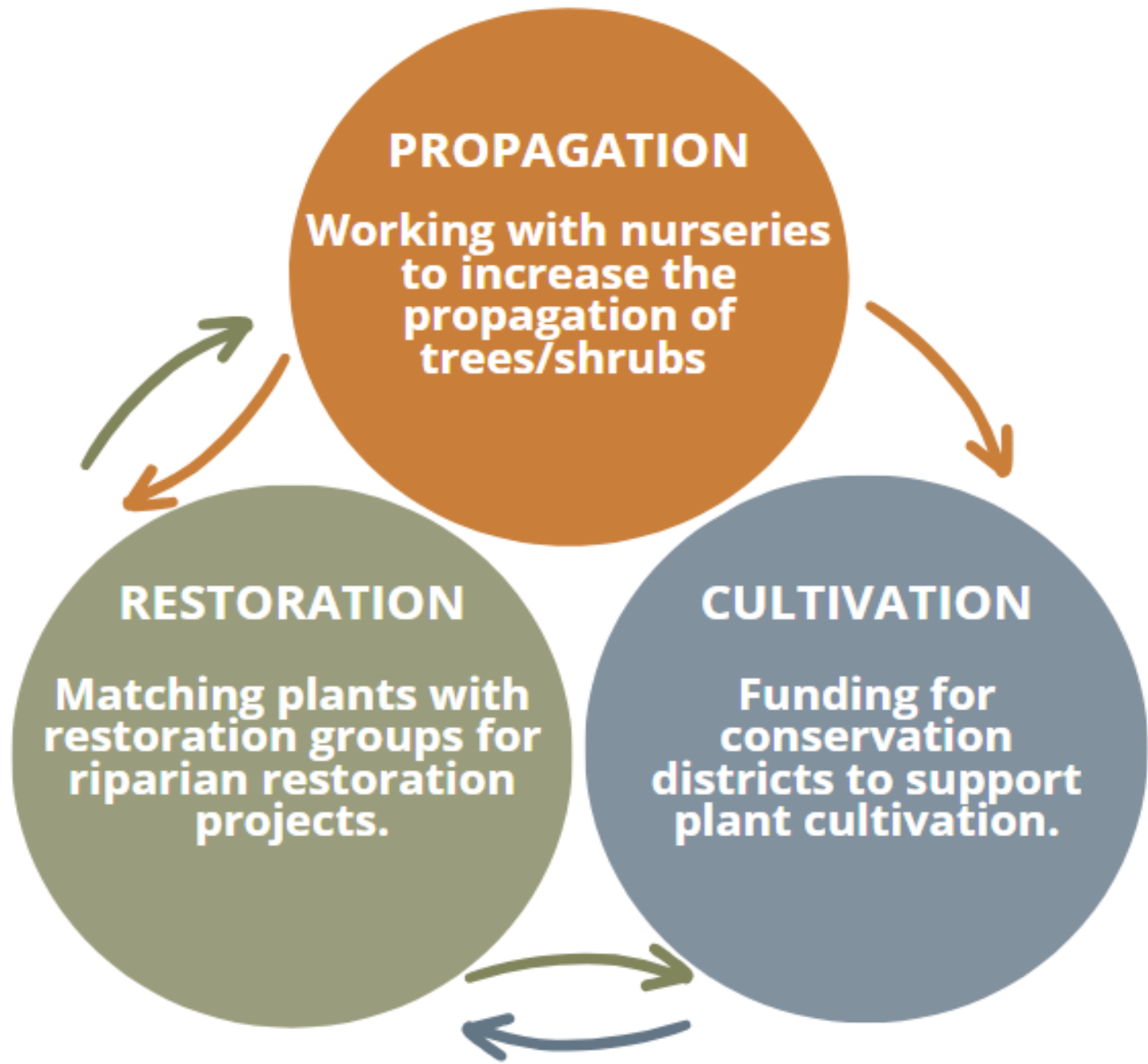
Program Overview

- \$1M annual budget
- Supports salmon recovery

Goal:

Increase the availability of native trees & shrubs for riparian restoration





Propagation

Contract grows with nurseries to provide plants to restoration groups

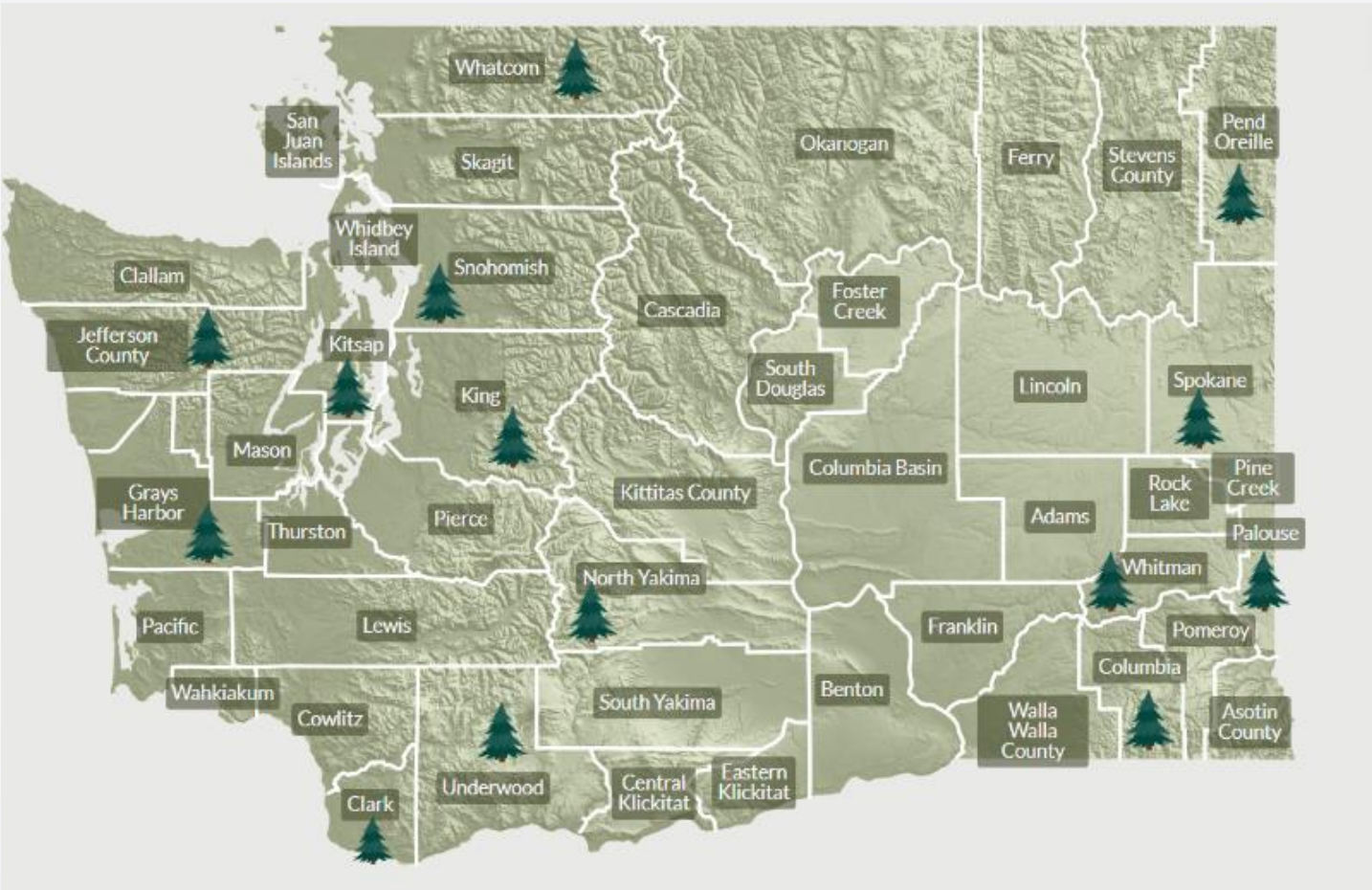
- Annual competitive solicitation
- Plants propagated 2–3 years

Cultivation

Annual funding for Conservation Districts to support cultivation

- Supports expansion, creation, & maintenance of holding sites
- Districts may partner with restoration groups

Infrastructure



Materials

Labor

Kitsap CD Holding Site

- Gravel bed method
- ~10,000 trees/shrubs
- 2.4 times more space efficient
- 85% more water efficient than overhead sprinklers



Jefferson CD Holding Site

- ~3,000 plants
- Partnering with North Olympic Salmon Coalition
- Volunteer plant maintenance



Restoration

Matching plants with restoration groups:

- Annual Plant Needs Form
- Includes: districts, non-profits, tribes, counties, state/govt agencies, etc.

Future Opportunities



Propagation:

- Next round of contract grows starting soon
- Plant delivery in fall 2027



Cultivation:

- Applications open in May for FY26



Restoration:

- Plant Needs Form coming this spring
