Call to Order 10:51am

- > Introductions, quorum achieved.
- Motion by Peter, second by Devin to approve the agenda with the addition of appointing Rick Hartson chair of the Protection Subcommittee. Approved unanimously; Brian abstains.
- ➤ Brian will be abstaining from all decisions until the SWC organizational structure and bylaws revisions are complete. *These will be on the next meeting agenda.
- > Tabled July notes, *putting on next meeting agenda.

Executive Director and Committee Reports

End of Year Financial Reports

- SWC is well into the black for the fiscal year, which ended June 30, in part due to decreased discretionary spending during COVID. New indirect rate of 15% (down from 21%) has been approved by RCO for the upcoming year. This is probably artificially low due to COVID and may put us a bit in the red this year. *Two next steps for the fiscal year completed include starting federal taxes and lining up an external financial audit. Two \$40k CDs matured and were renegotiated for another year at 1.5%. Motion by Brendan and 2nd by Peter to approve June Financial Reports, approved unanimously, Brian abstains.
- ➤ WDFW and SRSC are working on a NOAA habitat grant proposed partnership to fund remaining final designs and construction of our large estuary restoration projects, including Milltown Phase 2 (for match purposes), Deepwater, Smokehouse, and Similk Bay.

Committees

- ➤ Protection Subcommittee approved (without quorum) the Approval Process for Acquiring Restorable Lands from TWG. The acquired lands report for January to June is in the packet.
- ➤ M&AM Subcommittee has not met this month.
- > TWiG approved the Approval Process for Acquiring Restorable Lands. Also reviewed 4 year work plan and planned project list.
- No CEC report today.

Old Business

Communications

Peter says County sees estuary restoration as important but should not be used for external compensatory mitigation. County still committed to estuary restoration for salmon.

Approval Process for Acquisition of Restorable Lands

- ➤ It's not 100% perfect, but we've been working on documenting this process for a year. We want to see how it works and amend later if needed. We hope this is a significant improvement to help us move forward on joint efforts to protect and restore habitat, incentivizing early, proactive planning across organizations.
- > Conservation landowners need the new process not to slow down acquisitions.
- Motion by Peter, second by Devin to approve the Process. All approve, Brian abstains.

Letter to PSP and Salmon Recovery Council regarding PSAR roll over policy for 2022

Motion by Peter, second by Brendan to approve the draft letter with some minor revisions to reflect LECC discussion. All approve, Brian abstains.
